HOW TO PARTICIPATE

1. Maximize Engagement

Start with the Unit Overview and get creative with your own lesson plan, inviting participation from your classes, the whole school, and your greater school community.

2. Get Drawing

Your unique vision for your classroom Fundred workshops will help students embrace this collective effort and become part of the solution. Remember only one Fundred per person.

3. Prepare your Fundreds for collection

Once you have completed your Fundreds, bundle and label your school's contributions using the provided Fundred Bundle Bands. Fundred drop off and pick up will begin as the week of February 13, more details coming soon...

4. See your artwork on view

Your Fundreds will join hundreds of thousands from across the country in the exhibition "Kids are Worth It" at the Corcoran School of Art & Design from February 22 – March 12. Invite your students and families to visit – be on the lookout for an invitation to share!
